Learning Outcomes

Thea sim of the course is that students further develop their literary critical competence and their skills in problematising historical traditions by advanced study of the blurring of boundaries between poststructuralist theories and the postmodern literature in the period from1966 to 1997.

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- demonstrate knowledge of poststructuralist theories, postmodern litrature and the blurring of boundaries,

- demonstrate ability to identify theoretical problems with relevance to postmodernist fiction and independently elaborate on these,

- demonstrate skills in advanced literary analysis,

- give a detailed account of and critically analyse dominant theoretical, aesthetic and literary historical features in the movements treated.

Content and Form of Instruction

The course deals with the impact of poststructuralist teories on literature from 1966 to 1997.

Examination

Assessment is individual and based on an oral or written exam.

#### Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.
