Course Approval

The syllabus was approved by the Faculty of Health, Science and Technology 2020-03-11, and is valid from the Autumn semester 2020 at Karlstad University.

Prerequisites

Anatomy and Physiology (7.5 ECTS credits), or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

The aim of the course is for students to acquire basic knowledge of pathology and related therapeutic strategies.

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- describe pathophysiological mechanisms in the cells, tissues, and organs of the human body and how these cause illness,
- demonstrate general knowledge of epidemiology and the underlying causes, including etiology, symptoms, treatment, and prognosis for the major groups suffering from somatic disease in the population,

- describe medical therapies and other potential forms of treatment in general terms,
- explain how pathological changes in certain organs can affect other organs and organ systems in the body, and
- describe how different pathophysiological processes can be monitored using chemical analyses and physiological examination methods.

Content

Instruction is in the form of lectures and seminars.

The course includes the following components:

- Cell damage
- Inflammation and healing
- Cancer
- Cardiovascular disease
- Asthma
- Allergy
- Diabetes
- General pharmacology

Treatment, chemical and physiological examination methods, and incidence of disease in different parts of the population will be related to each group of diseases.

Examination

Assessment is based on an individual written exam and seminars.
