Prerequisites

Completed 60 ECTS course credits on the Dance Pedagogy programme

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- discuss their own skills in dancing with dynamic qualities and spatial and temporal articulation,
- independently and with enhanced dance technical skills, express dynamic qualities and dance with dynamic qualities and spatial and temporal articulation, and
- technically and artistically perform in depth dance assignments.

Content

The course comprises the following components:

- traditional Western artistic dance with a focus on in depth technical dance skills, dynamics and time
- self-evaluation/self-reflection

Instruction is in the form of daily training, journal writing, literature study.

Examination

Assessment of learning outcomes is individual and based on dance performance in groups and an individual hand-inassignment.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course. The grade Distinction for the whole course is awarded to students who have earned this grade for at least 5 of the 7.5 course credits.

Quality Assurance

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement. Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of any measures to be taken.

Course Certificate

A course certificate will be provided upon request.
