#### Course Approval

The syllabus was approved by the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences 2017-09-14, and is valid from the Spring semester 2018 at Karlstad University.

#### Prerequisites

Completed 75 ECTS course credits for the Dance Pedagogy programme, including the modules Theoretical and Artistic Perspectives on Dance 6 ECTS cr for the course MGG002, 15 ECTS cr, and Choreographic Method and Artistic Project 6 ECTS cr for the course MGG003, 15 ECTS cr.

#### Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- create, realize and express their own artistic visions,
- argue for a choice in an artistic process,
- identify and argue for a problem relevant to the dance programme,
- seek, compile and critically assess research studies in relation to an artistic idea,
- design, complete and report a minor research project,
- discuss and reflect on the result and conclusions of their own artistic and research project, and
- critically review their own research work and that of others.

#### Content

The course comprises the following components:

- completion of a minor independent artistic and academic work
- supervision

Supervision is provided for the course duration. Reregistered students are offered additional

supervision if circumstances permit.

**Examination**

Assessment is based on an independent academic essay and related artistic work, presented and discussed in a mandatory seminar, and on student's performance as a peer reviewer.

The number of assessment opportunities is limited to five.

**Grades**

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

**Quality Assurance**

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement. Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of any measures to be taken.
