Course Approval

Prerequisites

90 ECTS credits in Music, including at least 30 ECTS credits at the G2F level or higher. As well as a passing grade for an entrance exam test.

4. within given time limits, independently plan, learn, and perform a concert programme at a highly qualified musical and technical level, demonstrating an independent, creative, and innovative approach to the material,

5. in a chosen area of music and both national and international contexts, problematise, discuss, and apply their musical performance and artistic issues in dialogue with other musicians and artists,

6. demonstrate excellent musical and instrumental competence required for a career as an independent, highly skilled professional musician in a chosen area of music,

Judgement and approach

7. reflect critically upon their own and other people's artistic approach and the role of music and art in society,

 8. provide arguments for assessments and evaluations of artistic expression in various musical and artistic contexts in terms of relevant societal and ethical aspects, and
9. identify their own need for, and independently develop, the skills required for a reliable career as an established musician.

Content

Students study, interpret, and perform an advanced repertoire at the artistic and professional level required for an international career as a soloist or a chamber musician. The course includes instrument instruction, ensemble, study with piano accompaniment or repertoire study and stage preparation, entrepreneurship and concerts. Instruction is in the form of individual lessons, group lessons, seminars, and master classes. Upon completion of the course, students are awarded an "Artist diploma".

Examination

Module 1: Artist diploma I Learning outcomes 1, 2, 3, and 4 are assessed based on musical performance. Learning outcomes 1, 2, and 5 are assessed based on oral presentations.

Module 2: Artist diploma II Learning outcomes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 are assessed based on musical performance. Learning outcomes 1, 2, 5, 7, 8, and 9 are assessed based on oral presentations.

Submissions for assessment must clearly indicate individual contributions.

If students have a decision from Karlstad University entitling them to Targeted Study Support due to a documented disability, the examiner has the right to give such students an adapted examination or to examine them in a different manner.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Quality Assurance

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement. Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of any measures to be taken.
