Major Field of Study

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- plan, conduct, and evaluate varied and flexible playful instrument instruction for second-year learners on an instrument family and across in a teacher team and with a leading function,
- plan, conduct and evaluate a varied music project across instrument families for age and skills integrated groups in a teacher team and with a leading function,
- apply advanced methods and models for playful learning in the instruction of second-year learners on an instrument family and across, and
- identify and apply advanced knowledge of group dynamic processes in groups of young learners in an instrument family and across.

Content and Form of Instruction

The course comprises the following components:

- methodology for a playful start on the instrument
- instrument rhythmic
- playful learning of pulse, rhythm, movement, song, pitch, reading simple music
- the group dynamics in mixed instrument work teams and student groups
- practical application of instructing young children in mixed instrument groups and working on a joint project performance

Examination

Assessment is based on practical tests individually and in groups, oral group performance, individual hand-in assignments and take-home exam.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G) or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Quality Assurance

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement. Course assessment is based on student views and experiences as reported in written course evaluations and/or group discussions. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of the measures to be taken.
