MIGI25 Instrumental or Voice Studies V (7.5 ECTS credits), or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- perform music from at least two different styles and demonstrate instrumental or voice skills in relation to the chosen music,
- reflect upon different ways of communicating musically and demonstrate good communicative skills in performance situations,
- apply selected warm-up exercises in practice and justify the selection, as well as demonstrate good ergonomic posture for the instrument in question or for singing, and
- describe strategies and methods for developing skills in playing the chosen instrument or in singing.

Content

The course includes the following components:

- Playing instruments or singing
- Warm-up and ergonomic exercises
- Musical performance and communication
- Stage preparedness
- Strategies and methods for skills training and development

Examination

Assessment is based on musical performance and individual oral presentations.
