#### Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to

1. reflect on form, style and performance praxis in a repertoire,
2. demonstrate good technical instrument or vocal skills,
3. describe and apply different techniques and methods when rehearsing and performing a repertoire,
4. discern and test different technical and rendition solutions in a repertoire,
5. rehearse and perform a repertoire in terms of basic knowledge of form, style and performance praxis,
6. perform a repertoire musically and demonstrate good ability to communicate music, and
7. reflect on their own learning process in instrument or vocal performance.

#### Content

Students rehearse and perform an instrumental or vocal repertoire. Technical aspects and methods of rehearsing and performing a repertoire are treated.

For solo instrument or vocal studies some accompaniment is included.

Instruction is in the form of individual rehearsal and individual lessons and group activities.

Assessment is individual and based on musical performances and oral presentations.

**Grades**

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.
