### Course Approval

The syllabus was approved by the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences 2018-02-15, and is valid from the Autumn semester 2018 at Karlstad University.

### Prerequisites

60 ECTS credits completed for a music programme involving music theory.

### Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to

1. apply the basic grammar and terminology of music,
2. identify and describe harmonic functions in Western major and minor tonal music,
3. describe the principles of voice leading in the tradition of Western functional harmony,
4. notate and reproduce simple melodies, chords and chord progressions with voice and instrument
5. notate and reproduce some rhythms with voice and instrument and
6. reflect on their own ability for self-regulation in their practical ear-training.

### Content

The course includes music theory, chord analysis, basic chord progressions and musical structure techniques, ear training and practical ear training.

Instruction is mainly in groups with occasional individual tutoring.

Assessment is based on:

Learning outcomes 1-3: individual written hand-in assignments.
