#### Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- give an account of the basics of project management methodology and information publishing,
- understand and explain how printed matter can function as a communication channel,
- give an account of the production chain from idea to finished information product,
- apply knowledge of project management methodology for printed information products.

#### Content

The area of project management is introduced, including project management methodology. Project management knowledge is applied to an information project where students acquire knowledge and skills in the production of information material, from idea to graphic design for publication in printed form. An important part of the course is discussions and reflections on the choice of communication channel and how this choice affects how the information is handled.

Assessment is based on a written exam, individual hand-in assignments and group work.

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.
