Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- discuss and defend their projects.

Content

Students identify an economics problem and apply a relevant method to analyse the problem. Students work independently under supervision. The result is discussed at a seminar with the participation of fellow-students, the supervisor and a co-examiner.

Assessment is based on a written research project, presented and discussed in a mandatory seminar.

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.
