### Course Approval

The syllabus was approved by the Faculty of Health, Science and Technology 2021-01-29, and is valid from the Autumn semester 2021 at Karlstad University.

### Prerequisites

45 ECTS credits completed in the Programme in Dental Hygiene, including Introduction to Oral Health - Theories, Profession and Science (7.5 ECTS credits), Anatomy, physiology, and medical microbiology for dental hygienists (7.5 ECTS credits), Preclinical studies for the dental hygienist, theory and method (15 ECTS credits), and Science theory and methods, basic course (7.5 ECTS credits), and registered on the courses Health psychology and communication (7.5 ECTS credits) and Oral Health Prevention - Clinical Studies I (7.5 ECTS credits)

### Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- give an account of the meaning of basic concepts in the field of public health science,

- describe theories and models of health promotion,
- demonstrate knowledge of relevant ordinances in the field of public health,
- give an account of health determinants in a life cycle perspective and their significance for oral health,
- give an account of the meaning of human rights in relation to oral health,
- explain the concepts domestic violence and men's violence against women, as well as different forms of violence,
- give an account of the meaning of the concept epidemiology as well as oral health index,
- give an account of the epidemiology of the most common oral diseases internationally and nationally,
- give an account of the concept of health literacy,

#### Competence and skills

- draft a plan for oral health education from an arena perspective, and identify transprofessional collaboration in the area,

#### Judgement and approach

- reflect upon how epidemiology can be used for oral health promotion from the perspective of public health science, and
- reflect upon the role of the dental hygienist in oral health promotion, especially regarding human rights, gender equality, and sustainable development.
