Prerequisites

At least 60 ECTS cr undergraduate level studies in nursing and health care or equivalent plus upper secondary school level Swedish B/B2 and English A.

Major Field of Study

OMA (Nursing Science)

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- extract and explain the characteristic principles of palliative care philosophy,
- describe how palliative care philosophy can be implemented in different forms of care,
- identify and analyse common symptoms in palliative care,
- motivate relevant measures related to the patient's physical, mental, social, existential and cultural needs,
- identify needs and evaluate the importance of talking with the patient and next-of-kin in the different stages of palliative care,
- identify and analyse ethical dilemmas in palliative care.

Content and Form of Instruction

Instruction is in the form of introductory lectures, literature studies, skills training, groupwork and seminar.

The course integrates nursing (5.5. ECTS cr) and medical science (2 ECTS cr) in course components and examination.

Palliative care philosophy

- palliative care forms and organisation
- symptoms in palliative care
- symptom alleviation measures and complementary and medical treatment
- ethics and communication
- laws, regulations and guidelines.

Examination

Assessment is individual and in the form of a take-home exam discussed in a seminar.

Grades

One of the grades Fail (U), Pass (G), or Distinction (VG) is awarded in the examination of the course. Assessment criteria for the grade of Distinction are specified in the study guide.

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement. Course assessment is based on student views and experiences as reported in written course evaluations and/or group discussions. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of the measures to be taken.
