Knowledge and understanding

1. Describe qualitative and quantitative methods in nursing research and the characteristics of the respective approaches
2. Describe methods for literature studies in nursing research and their characteristics.

Competence and skills

3. Apply and give an account of structured database search
4. Plan and design a research project

Judgement and approach

5. Identify research ethical principles and give examples in relation to nursing research

Content

Instruction is in the form of lectures, literature studies, study assignments, seminar assignments and supervision.

The course comprises the following components:

- Research ethics

- Qualitative and quantitative methods
- Literature studies as a method
- Database search
- Research design in the form of a research project proposal (PM)

Examination

Assessment is individual and group-related and based on a written exam, take-home exams, seminars and a research project proposal. Additional material may be submitted for the assessment of the project proposal if submitted within ten days of notification.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G) or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.
