Course Approval

Prerequisites

1. Completed Master programme in Educational Leadership and School Development, or equivalent, and
2. PAAUT5 School as a Learning Organisation 15 ECTS credits, PAAUT6 School Development in Theory and Practice 15 ECTS credits and PAAUM7 Research Methods II 15 ECTS credits, or equivalent.

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to

- identify and formulate their own research questions in relation to research, in an independent, systematic and critical way,
- plan and conduct a study based on different theories and their methodological approaches and analytical processes,
- identify and thoroughly analyse ethical problems in their own and others' studies,
- systematically and independently analyse, assess and deal with complexity in empirical data material,
- orally and in writing give an account of and critically discuss choice of methods and conclusions in their own and others' studies.

Content

The aim of the course is that students further deepen and widen their understanding of how to formulate, operationalise, analyse, assess and present problems in school activities in the light of theoretical perspectives. Under supervision, students plan, conduct and report a study related to school contexts in writing. Students also act as peer reviewers of fellow-students' works.

Examination

Assessment is based on an independent project presented and discussed in seminar, and on student's performance as a peer reviewer. If the examiner finds that the submitted project does not meet the requirements, the student may be requested to submit supplementary tasks.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Quality Assurance

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement. Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of any measures to be taken.
