## **Major Field of Study**

Psychology

## **Learning Outcomes**

Upon completion of the course, students should have acquired:

- -a broad foundational knowledge of the origin and history of transpersonal psychology, and its prominent authorities and their research and theories,
- -an understanding of the concept of altered states of consciousness and the ways in which such states can be treated or made use of in a clinical context and in psychotherapy,
- -a basic understanding of the differences between Western and Eastern perspectives on knowledge and conceptions of the world, and a basic understanding of the similarities and the differences between the spiritual/religious belief systems of natural peoples, on the one hand, and those of the world religions, on the other,
- -an understanding of expressions of spirituality in modern Western trends such as New Age and private religion, and
- -a broad foundational knowledge of clinical conditions such as psychoses and spiritual emergencies, as well as how these conditions can be treated.

#### Content and Form of Instruction

The course begins with a general overview of the theory of science and history of transpersonal psychology. The course also covers different and altered states of consciousness, spiritual emergencies, and the role of

spirituality in everyday life. Both Eastern and Western knowledge perspectives are included. The application of transpersonal psychology in psychotherapy and clinical practice are also addressed briefly.
