Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- give an account of different central theoretical models and analyses in cognitive behaviour therapy (CBT), give an account of central intervention methods in CBT, and
- perform simple analyses based on a CBT perspective in different areas of behaviour.

Content and Form of Instruction

The course deals with the methods of cognitive behaviour therapy, motivating sessions, behaviour analysis, exposure and emotional evasion, psychoeducation, values and cognitive restructuring and relapse prevention.

Examination

Assessment is based on hand-in laboratory assignments and assignments presented and discussed at schedule seminars. Attendance is required at a minimum of four seminars. Students who fail to meet this requirement will have to submit a written assignment. Assessment is also based on a written individual report, presented and defended at a seminar. Students are also required to serve as the opponent to a fellow-student's report in order to complete the course.
