Prerequisites

Admission to the real estate management programme (SGFEK), plus the courses RVGA42 Introduction to Real Estate Law 15 ECTS cr and RVGA43 Real Estate Tax Law 15 ECTS cr, or equivalent.

Learning Outcomes

Knowledge and understanding

Upon completion of the course the students should be able to

- -demonstrate in-depth knowledge of the general and specific real estate law,
- -demonstrate in-depth knowledge of contract law, especially issues relating to interpreting and drawing up deeds of conveyance,
- -demonstrate in-depth knowledge of real estate law with a focus on right of use, tenancy agreement, ownership right and servitute,
- -demonstrate knowledge of building law and environmental law
- give an in-depth account of entrepreneurship law, and
- demonstrate in-depth knowledge of business law related to real estate management, real estate agent legislation and trade practice.

Competence and skills

Upon completion of the course, the students should be able to

- -identify, describe, analyse and solve legal problems in connection with real estate transactions as well as problems connected with the specific real estate law area,
- -draft written agreements, primarily conveyances,
- -independently search for and interpret legal source material.

Judgement and approach

Upon completion of the course the students should be able to

- -demonstrate the ability to make judgements and assessments with consideration of the scientific, social and ethical aspects relating to real estate law, and
- -demonstrate the judgement and approach relevant to the legal areas studied on this course,
- demonstrate awareness of the ethical and moral aspcts facing the legislators and practitioners in the real estate area.

Content and Form of Instruction

Students further develop their knowledge of the legal aspects of real estate management. The various areas of realestate law are treated in terms of agent/manager duties and responsibilities. The course also covers general and specific real estate law with a focus on property purchase, including contract law, user rights, servitute, tenancy agreement, and tenant-owner associations. This means that conveyance of a property and ownership flats as well as related leagal issues are treated.

Legislation on planning and building construction, registration of property, environmental law and entrepreneurship law are treated. Included are also rules on when and if public agencies can intervene in private maintenance and disposition of properties.

The course also includes a survey of real estate agent legislation and praxis.

Examination

Assessment of learning outcomes is based on a written exam and a PM, presented and discussed in a mandatory seminar.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Course assessment is based on student views and experiences as reported in written course evaluations and/or group discussions. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of the measures to be taken.
