Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- 1) give an account of the theory and history of classical rhetoric,
- 2) give an account of differences between oral and written communication and discuss how these differences can be taken into account in the performance of planned oral presentations,
- 3) make use of the theory of classical rhetoric to plan and deliver oral presentations of various kinds,
- 4) discuss adaptations of planned speeches in response to changed outer circumstances, and
- 5) give constructive feedback to others' oral presentations and make use of others' response on their own oral presentations to evaluate their own performance.

Content

The course covers the theory, history, and methods of classical rhetoric. Students learn to apply the theory through the planning and delivering of various kinds of speeches as well as through written reflections. Giving constructive feedback and participating in discussions on alternative speech formats is a central part of the course.

Examination

Learning outcome 1 is assessed on the basis of an individual written assignment.

Learning outcomes 2 and 3 are assessed on the basis of individual oral presentations, participation in oral group discussions, and an individual written assignment.

Learning outcome 4 is assessed on the basis of participation in oral group discussions.
Learning outcome 5 is assessed on the basis of participation in oral group discussions and an individual written assignment.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U), is awarded in the examination of the course.

Quality Assurance

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement. Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation.
