Course Approval

The syllabus was approved by the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences 2018-04-18, and is valid from the Spring semester 2018 at Karlstad University.

Prerequisites

General admission requirements with the exception of the prerequisite of upper secondary level Swedish, and the course SFGA01 Swedish as a Foreign language I, 7.5 ECTS cr, or equivalent.

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, the student should be able to:

1. demonstrate understanding of phrases and common words relating to the personal sphere,
2. grasp the gist of short, clear and simple messages and announcements,
3. reproduce the main content and identify implicit information in short, everyday texts,
4. participate in short informal conversations on familiar topics,
5. write a simple text on familiar topics and on their own experiences,
6. use more complex parts of Swedish syntax, and
7. demonstrate skills in Swedish prosody.

Content

The course consists of instruction and practical exercises in Swedish language proficiency and communication skills, with an emphasis on further improving Swedish grammar and syntax and the Swedish sound systems and prosody. Students are also given opportunities to expand their basic vocabulary and practise oral skills in informal conversation, as well as improve skills in writing, reading and listening.

Examination

Assessment is based on an oral test, listening comprehension test and a written exam.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Quality Assurance

Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation.
