### Course Approval

The syllabus was approved by the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences 2023-02-21, and is valid from the Autumn semester 2023 at Karlstad University.

### Prerequisites

General admission requirements with the exception of the prerequisite of upper secondary level Swedish, and at least 4 ECTS credits completed in the course SFGA01 Swedish as a foreign language I, 7.5 ECTS cr, or equivalent

### Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, the student should be able to:

1. demonstrate understanding of and use phrases and common words relating to the personal sphere,
2. grasp the gist of short and clear oral messages and announcements,
3. reproduce the main content and identify implicit information in short, everyday texts,
4. participate in short informal conversations on familiar topics,
5. write a simple text on familiar topics and on their own experiences,
6. use more complex parts of Swedish grammar and syntax, and
7. demonstrate skills in Swedish prosody.

**Content**

The course consists of instruction and practical exercises in Swedish language proficiency and communication skills, with an emphasis on further improving Swedish grammar and syntax and the Swedish sound systems, especially prosody. Students are also given opportunities to expand their basic vocabulary and phrases, develop oral skills in informal conversation, as well as improve skills in writing, reading and listening in relation to familiar topics.

**Examination**

Learning outcome 1 is assessed based on an individual written listening comprehension test, a written exam, and an oral test completed in pairs.

Learning outcome 2 is assessed based on an individual written listening comprehension test.

Learning outcomes 3, 5, and 6 are assessed based on a written exam.

Learning outcomes 4 and 7 are assessed based on an oral test completed in pairs.

If students have a decision from Karlstad University entitling them to Targeted Study Support due to a documented disability, the examiner has the right to give such students an adapted examination or to examine them in a different manner.

**Grades**

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

**Quality Assurance**

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement. Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of any measures to be taken.
