Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- evaluate and assess the connection between theoretical and practical knowledge in their professional practice,
- evaluate and assess how their own personality impacts on their professional practice as social workers,
- evaluate and assess the importance of team work in social work,
- evaluate and assess ethical considerations in social work.

Content and Form of Instruction

Instruction is in the form of lectures, group exercises, supervision in groups and seminars.

Supervised group reflections on personal and professional development in relation to future professional fields.

Personal and Professional Development (PPU) is also related to the theoretical subjects studied in the semester. The course runs throughout the fourth semester in the form of recurring group sessions.

Examination

Assessment is based on group discussions (so called supervision offerings) and seminars.

Grades

One of the grades Pass (G) or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course (Vice Chancellor decision C2012/323).

Quality Assurance

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement. Course assessment is based on student views and experiences as reported in written course evaluations and/or group discussions. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of the measures to be taken.

Additional Information

Students who enrolled before 1 July 2007 will complete their studies in accordance with the requirements of the earlier admission. Upon completion students may request degree and course certificates to be issued under the current ordinance if they meet its requirements.
