Course Approval

Prerequisites

90 ECTS completed in a Social Science main area of study, including a degree project at the G2F level of at least 15 ECTS credits, and upper secondary level Swedish 3 or Swedish as a second language 3 and English 5, or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. compare different theoretical perspectives and views of human beings in relation to three sociological themes: recognition, authenticity, and resonance,

2. reflect upon and give an account of how the themes covered in the course can be relevant for analyses of contemporary societal phenomena, and

3. select and analyse an empirical example based on the themes covered in the course.

Content

The course comprises lectures and seminars focused on three themes: recognition, authenticity, and resonance. Part of the course content focuses on how themes in sociological theory can be used to develop a critical understanding of contemporary and current phenomena, and seminars are spent investigating how the themes covered in the course are relevant for contemporary societal phenomena. In a mandatory final seminar, students share and discuss their own plans for the individual hand-in assignment.

Examination

Assessment is based on an individual written hand-in assignment and active participation in a seminar.

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.
