# **Learning Outcomes**

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to

- demonstrate knowledge of the human being as a group and social being and how this knowledge affects the practice of socio-spatial planning,
- basic understanding of social structures and their importance to groups and individuals in society,
- basic knowledge of inclusion and exclusion processes in society and how these can be understood in a socio-spatial planning perspective.

# Content and Form of Instruction

Sociological and socio-psychological theories on the relation between the individual, groups and society are treated. Special attention is given to understanding the human being in a social context, as a group and social being, and its impact on the socio-spatial planning practice.

A central theme is the cultural and social determination of human action. The possible effects of social structures (e.g. class, ethnicity and gender) on individual options and their effects are discussed and problematised in terms of people in general and community planners in particular.

The course also deals with the issue of understanding contemporary society in terms of integration and inclusion, on the one hand, and segregation ans exclusion on the other.

Instruction is in the form of lectures, seminars and group discussions.
