Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- explain the intellectual historical development of tourism studies, basic theories and concepts,
- give an account of the history and development of tourism and the theorisations of the development in the discipline,
- give an account of contemporary organisation and significance of tourism in different national and international contexts,

Competence and skills

- seek and use literature to study tourism in different historical and contemporary contexts,

Judgement and approach

- reflect on ethical issues in relation to the history and development of tourism, and
- reflect on the gender perspective in relation to tourism and social development.

### Content

Tourism reflects society and affects its development in many ways. The course introduces tourism studies as an academic field, and tourism as a social phenomena. Central concepts and theories are introduced and reviewed. The emergence of tourism in a historical perspective from Antiquity to our time is treated, along with forms of travel, methods and driving forces as well as its political, economic, social and cultural meanings in different epochs. The history of tourism is related to the theoretical and conceptual development in tourism studies.

Students are introduced to academic writing, the basics of the research process, and basic methods to address the development of tourism.
