Only 2 out of 35 registered students answered the evaluation questionnaire which makes it hard to draw generalizable conclusions. However, based on the course evaluations, class discussions and emails received from participating students, the general impression is that they evaluated the structure, the content, the contact with the teacher/course convenor and the overall logic of the course very positively in relation to the learning outcomes. One student mentioned that writing 4 papers for a 7,5 hp course might initially be experienced as overwhelming by some, but overall the assignments appear to work well, especially taking into consideration that this is a distance course.

## Suggestions for changes to the next course date.

In comparison to the previous occasion this course was given, the following key changes were made this semester: a more detailed course guide was provided, a course introduction as well as a number of opportunities for questions/guidance in relation to each of the assignments were offered via zoom, an oral component was added to one of the assignments. Based on the positive feedback received by students, there does not appear a need for radical changes in the near future. However, an effort should be made to keep the course literature as updated as possible, given the thematic focus of the course.

1. **Number of first registrations for a course:** First registration = the first time a student registers for a specific course.
