4 students participated in the course evaluation survey.

The majority of them find the content and the structure of the course support the achievement of learning outcomes. Most of them also find the assessment adhere to and supportive of learning outcomes. Most of the students used around 20 to 29 hours per week for this course. There are also some students who reported that they needed 40 hours per week. Most of the students find that the receptions from teachers and other staff as professional. Students liked the structure of the course, especially the combination of relevant texts, the coupling of method and content lectures, and general discussions.

Suggestions for changes to the next course date.

Students suggested more live lectures instead of recorded ones and more randomised discussion groups. Some students also expressed need for more feedback, including feedback from peers.
