Only two students filled out the questionnaire. One student indicated that they were happy with the course overall, and the other indicated that they were less so. In the comment section, the following issues were raised:

- The literature module(s) was/were perceived as very demanding in terms of the required reading and other assignments.

- Some of the breakout sessions during literature seminars were felt to be too long, and students ran out of things to discuss. They also wished the teacher to visit the breakout rooms more frequently.

- Some of the pre-recorded lectures for the literature module(s) were felt to be confusing, as the teacher referred to novels that were no longer on the reading list for the course.

- The literature exam tested terminology that had not been explicitly dealt with in class (according to the student), and this was felt to be problematic.

- It was pointed out that Academic Writing was a good course and that all students should be required to take it before they take Linguistics II - or that the Linguistics course should be modified accordingly.

## Suggestions for changes to the next course date.

This was the first time that this exact course was offered. It is difficult to know to what extent the comments are representative of the student group, as only two students filled out the questionnaire, but we will take the comments and suggestions into account as we evaluate the course.
