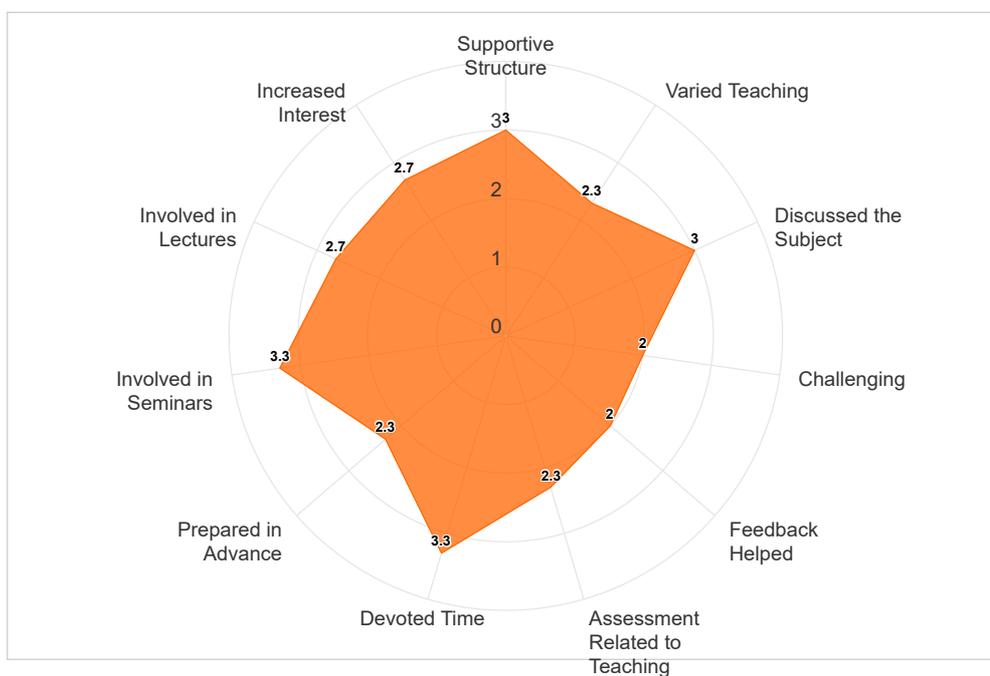

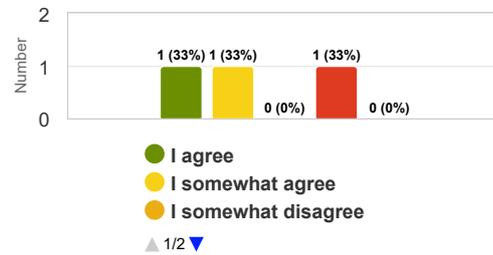

Results of learning

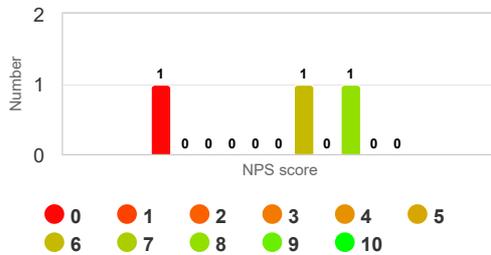
All in all, the course was valuable for me.

Net Promoter Score (NPS) = -66.67

The Net Promoter Score (NPS) is a metric that measures student experience and predicts the effectiveness of a course. It calculates an NPS score based on a key question using a 0-10 scale, asking how likely students would recommend the course to others. Respondents are grouped into Promoters, Passives, or Detractors based on their score, and the NPS is calculated by subtracting the percentage of Detractors from the percentage of Promoters. The NPS is a core metric for course evaluation programs and is trusted by educational institutions to engage their students and improve their learning experience performance.

Course supervisor's comments

In total 10 students actively participated in the course - all of them passed the written exam. Unfortunately, only 3 submitted course evaluations with some differing opinions (one positive, one neutral, one negative).

For addressing the main critical comment (limited time for discussions), we plan to re-organise the course, so that it provides more time for discussions, practical exercises and games for security/awareness training, and Mentimeter quizzes for training the course material. This time, we had to fit in more student paper presentations, which reduced the time for interactive discussions, which we will change for the next time. Apart from that, we anyhow will update the course material and also include further relevant findings from our own ongoing research projects on usable security and privacy.
