

Results of learning


All in all, the course was valuable for me.

The Net Promoter Score (NPS) is a metric that measures student experience and predicts the effectiveness of a course. It calculates an NPS score based on a key question using a 0-10 scale, asking how likely students would recommend the course to others. Respondents are grouped into Promoters, Passives, or Detractors based on their score, and the NPS is calculated by subtracting the percentage of Detractors from the percentage of Promoters. The NPS is a core metric for course evaluation programs and is trusted by educational institutions to engage their students and improve their learning experience performance.

Comments

Course supervisor's comments

Changes have been made to the previous semester's feedback to improve access to the main course book. The main course book has been changed to ensure currency and is now available as an unlimited e-book, ensuring easier access for all students.

The course evaluation from Autumn semester 2023 received feedback from 16 out of 57 students, indicating a relatively low response rate. Despite this, the comments provided valuable insights into areas of improvement and strengths of the course. Students expressed a desire for more interactive elements in the teaching, particularly suggesting an increase in group discussions during class and more seminars. Some students mentioned enjoying the seminars but wished for more opportunities to attend them in person rather than solely through Zoom. Moreover, students indicated a need for more time to delve deeper into their assignments to give a more comprehensive response. However, the students acknowledged the correlation between the classes, readings, and the seminars as the assignments incorporated these components. Additionally, the workload, particularly the amount of reading, was highlighted as a concern by some students, indicating a need for better management or distribution of course materials. On a positive note, students expressed appreciation for the teachers' positive and supportive attitude, exemplified by dedicated Zoom meetings for exams/assignments and Q&A thread, reflecting their satisfaction with the support received.
