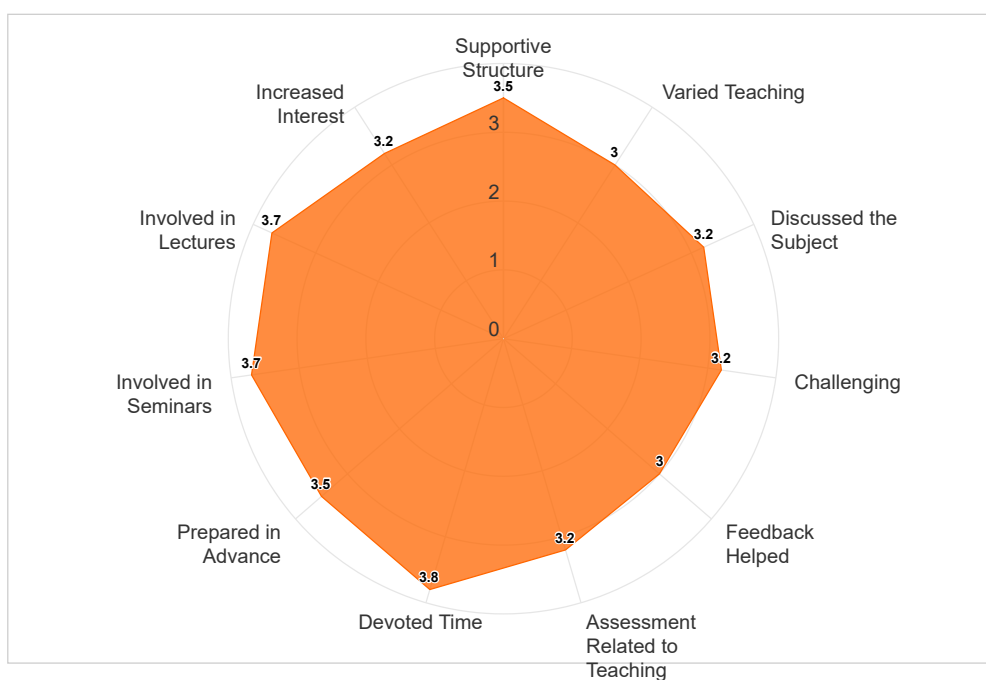

Mean value for each question. Highest value = 4.

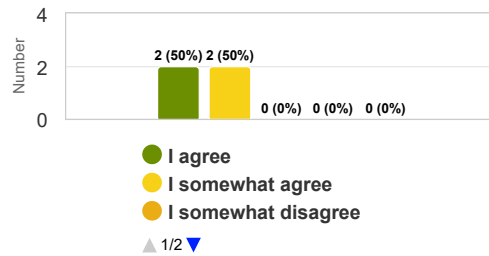

Results of learning

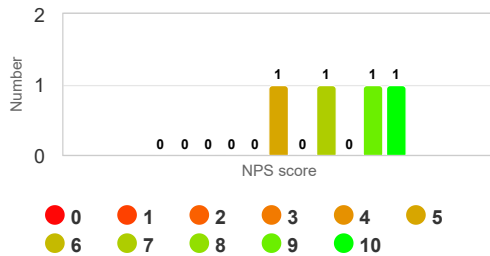
All in all, the course was valuable for me.

The Net Promoter Score (NPS) is a metric that measures student experience and predicts the effectiveness of a course. It calculates an NPS score based on a key question using a 0-10 scale, asking how likely students would recommend the course to others. Respondents are grouped into Promoters, Passives, or Detractors based on their score, and the NPS is calculated by subtracting the percentage of Detractors from the percentage of Promoters. The NPS is a core metric for course evaluation programs and is trusted by educational institutions to engage their students and improve their learning experience performance.

Comments

Course supervisor's comments

Four students have handed in all written assignments and gave an oral presentation, four more have completed one or more assignments. This means that eight students (rather than 15) did more than register for the course and that 50 % of the active students have answered. Out of the four students that filled in the course evaluation two appear to be very satisfied with the course and the other two fairly satisfied. Based on this report, no changes are required.

There are few free text comments. On the question "What enhanced your learning in this course?" one student has answered: "The seminar discussions with the students and Professor." Under the recommendations for learning for further learners, there is one comment: "Doing more readings around formal aspects and concepts of Fantasy particularly for first time learners approaching this genre. As for Science Fiction the course 'ENADL8 - Science Fiction and Intercultural Encounters' which is part of the master program provides ... in-depth knowledge around the topic." Another comment at the end of the report says, "I have enjoyed having new teachers for every seminar, but it was also a bit sad that we didn't have the chance to get to know the teachers better since there were so many. But the course was a really good course, the variation of teachers made us see things in different lights every seminar."
