

Mean value for each question. Highest value = 4.



Results of learning


All in all, the course was valuable for me.

The Net Promoter Score (NPS) is a metric that measures student experience and predicts the effectiveness of a course. It calculates an NPS score based on a key question using a 0-10 scale, asking how likely students would recommend the course to others. Respondents are grouped into Promoters, Passives, or Detractors based on their score, and the NPS is calculated by subtracting the percentage of Detractors from the percentage of Promoters. The NPS is a core metric for course evaluation programs and is trusted by educational institutions to engage their students and improve their learning experience performance.

Course supervisor's comments

This course is mostly taught through supervision session between a supervisor and the project groups. There also exists a detailed guide for B- and C-level theses which teachers should follow in their supervision. As convenor, I called a first meeting with all involved supervisors where we agreed on the standards, especially to use the uppsats guide as our common guideline. As far as I know, supervision went well for all groups, no group raised any issues during the process. The results were presented at a seminar with "formative evaluation" by the teachers; all groups presented. Comments were mailed to the students through Canvas on the same day so that they could do their revisions. All groups submitted the final paper. The results are exceptional in some cases in which very thorough and thought out analyses were conducted. Other papers showed some flaws, but nobody failed in the final examination.
