Students provided mixed answers in the course evaluations, while some said the exercises did not help, and were extremely long, most agreed that exercises helped. Also, students complained about the workload too high. On the other hand, there was a high passing rate and several students received very good grades, especially if they were active in the exercises and worked accordingly. This is why the exercises have been designed this way. They support the learning process. a 5 hour exam is the norm at KAU and due to online exam, the exam needs to be designed in a way so that the student can show that he/she understands the material. Nevertheless, there was passing rate as expected as well as grade distribution as expected. The seminar is needed in order to check the learning outcome of the course "read the current literature at the level of conference papers in this area and demonstrate knowledge of this area both orally and writing"

Suggestions for changes to the next course date.

For the next instance of the course the suggestion is to reduce number of slides and material to cover.
