

No changes were suggested, as no students filled out the questionnaire for HT21.







However, written comments align with oral feedback given to the course convener throughout the course.

Overall, the students seem satisfied with the first part of the course (Module 1 - Methods and Research in Media and Communication Studies) and less satisfied with the second part (Module 2 - Digital Research Methods & Research Design). For Module 2, the students express that the communication between the teachers has not worked well, that instructions have been unclear and that this has resulted in a lack of consistency regarding assessing the students' work.

Suggestions for changes to the next course date.

This course is undergoing a structural revision (without revising the syllabus) based on discussions between the teachers, programme leader and the Head of the subject. The feedback received both orally from students and the results of this questionnaire will be taken into consideration in the revision. Particularly, the students' comments on Module 2 will be incorporated in the course revisions, with clearer instructions for assignments. All teachers in this course will be invited to review the changes before they are formally made (later during VT23).
