Con: Course structure and the red thread from teacher to teacher and step to step.

Questions at the examination that are not included in the course literature or instructions.

The communication from some teachers and the communication between some teachers are inadequate.

Some literature that was read by the students was not treated.

Too much literature to read. Better that certain parts of a book are highlighted as central rather than an entire book.

Some literature did not feel relevant to tourism alt. not linked to tourism.

For many teachers on the course, various workshops, seminars and lectures. A few students indicate that there was too much work on a course of 7.5 credits.

Suggestions for changes to the next course date.

Fewer teachers on the course for understanding of structure and red thread.

Adapt the requirments for the literatur seminars to the credits (less course literature).

Reduce the number of seminars and workshops.

Add individual group tutorial to tutorial in half class.

Students may need clearer written instructions on what to include in the project assignment (their written results are part of their development and innovation process, which makes it difficult to give specific instructions).
