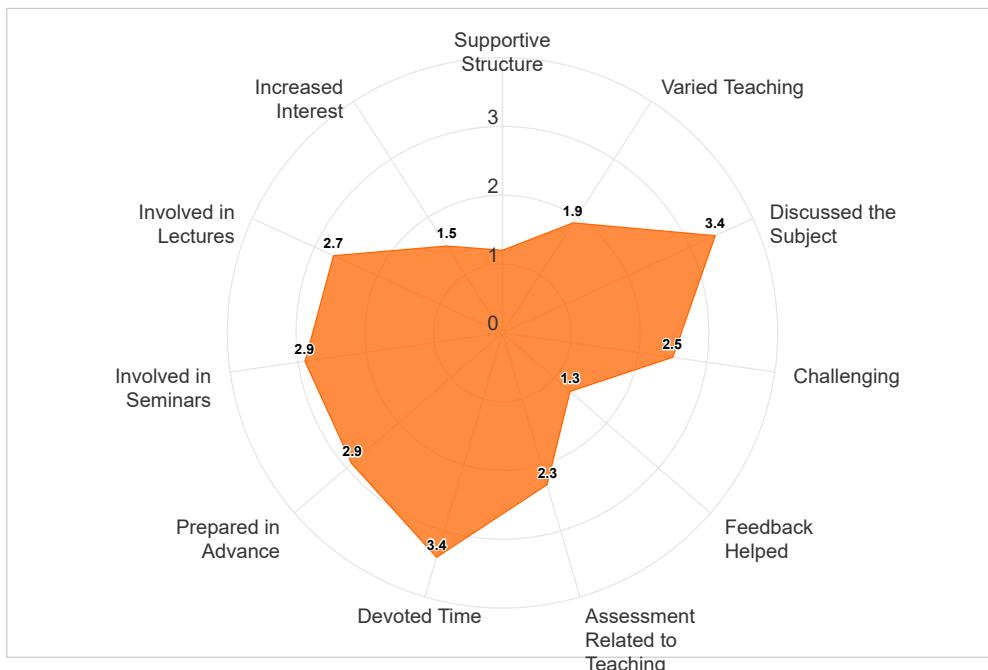

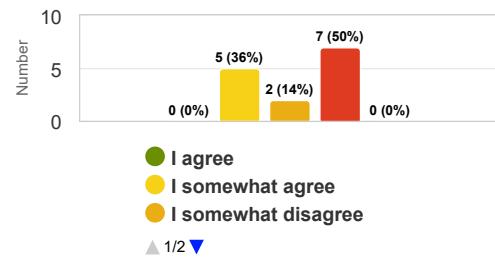

All in all, the course was valuable for me.

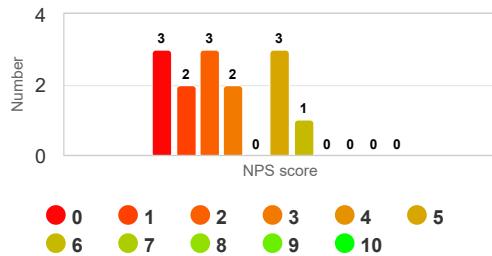

The Net Promoter Score (NPS) is a metric that measures student experience and predicts the effectiveness of a course. It calculates an NPS score based on a key question using a 0-10 scale, asking how likely students would recommend the course to others. Respondents are grouped into Promoters, Passives, or Detractors based on their score, and the NPS is calculated by subtracting the percentage of Detractors from the percentage of Promoters. The NPS is a core metric for course evaluation programs and is trusted by educational institutions to engage their students and improve their learning experience performance.



Comments

Course supervisor's comments

Kursen (både på campus och distans) genomgick en omstöpning där upplägget förändrades i grunden, från föreläsningar till workshops. För distansstudenterna innebar det mer uppgifter där de ombuds producera olika presentationer av begrepp och koncept för varandra, istället för att merparten av arbetet var att individuellt följa läsanvisningar till en kursbok. För campusstudenterna var tanken att kursen skulle genomföras i ett flipped classroom-format, där studenterna förberedde sig innan en workshop och arbetade med kursens innehåll tillsammans med varandra och lärare under workshops. Deltagandet i workshops var lågt, vilket gjorde att det inte gick att genomföra dem på det sätt det var tänkt. Här behöver upplägget skruvas lite på för att dels minska antalet begrepp och teorier studenterna behöver bekanta sig med, dels skapa klara incitament för studenterna att delta i workshops, dels öka den praktiska kopplingen mellan kursens lärandemål, workshops, tentamen och gruppuppgift. Studenterna efterfrågar också mer styrning och mer återkoppling från lärare.
