Course Analysis based on the Teacher's considerably more exhaustive Course Evaluation questionnaire:

The since long used and considerably more exhaustive Course Evaluation questionnaire, whose responses are enabling improvements of the course, was published on the course's its learning page. This Course Evaluation questionnaire, e.g., contains the two Student Union's questions on "Perceived quality" and "Perceived workload". All 2 active course participants answered this Course Evaluation questionnaire, which means a response rate of 100%.

Average "Perceived quality" among the course participants was 5 (both course participants perceived that this course provided a "Very high quality").

Average "Perceived workload" among the course participants was 3 (both perceived that this course implied an "Acceptable workload").

Q1: What are your main impressions from this course?

All in all it was very interesting.

The topics have been very good chosen.

A good thing is, that there is also a focus on topics like usability, because this is very important for the work life.

The course is very helpful to connect knowledge about IT and business activities. It gives a good overview about the importance that this connection is necessary to implement and use e-business and enterprise systems. The little number of participants made it possible to have an intense and nice learning atmosphere.

Q2: What individual knowledge acquired/lessons learned have you gained from participating in this course?

All topics were new to me. Especially the practical tasks were very helpful for my understanding. The application of the learned content of usability evoke my recognition of the structure/ performance of a website. Also the seminar that included group work allowed to understand modelling in practice.

Practicing a presentation is always important. So, it was good that it was part of the course.

The good atmosphere and that it was always possible to discuss and question things that were not clear. This increased the understanding of the topic strongly.
