Nine students out of fifteen answered and their views were somewhat mixed, but overall, the students seem to be content with the course.

Because of Covid some lectures and seminars had to move and at some occasions this was done with late notice. This is of course not ideal. There might also be a need for more communication between the teachers, which was also hindered somewhat by the current situation.

In response to comments about the seminars, I want to make clear that students who were present over Zoom but who did not participate actively in the seminars did not pass the seminar/s in question. This was made clear at the end of the seminar.

Suggestions for changes to the next course date.

Some students felt that the paper assignment was too demanding. The method of autoethnography is a challenge for many, not least because they are not familiar with it from previous studies. More time need to be spent on explaining how to use this method. It is important to introduce this early, and to have time for tutoring about the paper early on. The first literature seminar could be swapped for a seminar about autoethnography, perhaps discussing the example articles that are already made

available.

It would probably also be beneficial to have more communication with other course leaders in the program
