The teacher offered the usual Survey&Report Course Evaluation Survey about the Whole Course (with 16 questions), which collects a broader scope of perceptions from the course participants, and in turn is valuable feedback in order to being able to develop the course.

11 out of 12 course participants answered this survey (i.e. a response rate on this survey of 92%).

According to the survey report the average perceived quality of the whole course 'as 4.0 (was 3.9 in 2016).

10 out of 11 (91%) perceive that the overall course quality has been 'very high' or 'high'.

According to the survey report the average perceived work load during the course was 4.3 (was 3.7 in 2016). The result on the survey question about how many hours have been spent on this full time course shows that only 2 out of the 11 (18%) report that they have spent more than full-time on the course (41 hours or more).

In the context of this course, for the second year there was an innovative Project Work part with an entrepreneurship focus offered, which was highly appreciated by the course participants. The delivery of the Project Work was a result of a joint venture between the course responsible teacher, Drivhuset and Compare (providing 'the sharp case').

The teacher offered also a Course Evaluation Survey specifically about the Project Work part of the course, which provides valuable feedback in order to being able to develop the Project Work.

Before the Project Work in this course, 42% of the course participants had none, or a low degree of, previous experiences with the entrepreneurship subject matter. For these students, the Project Work part of the course with its focus on entrepreneurship has been particularly valuable for their future work life.

All, except one, (92%) of the course participants perceive that the Project Work course has stimulated some of their general competencies (i.e. ability to solve problems, ability to cooperate, power of initiative, creativity, etc) to a very high degree (3) or to a high degree (8).
