## **General Information**

The Political Science programme is part of the larger field of social science. For a Bachelor's degree to be awarded, students should take a combination of political science, economics and law.

## **Programme Aims**

The learning outcomes of the programme comprise the national outcomes that have to be fulfilled to be awarded a Bachelor's degree, and the local programme outcomes.

### National outcomes

#### *Knowledge and understanding*

For a Bachelor's degree, students shall:

- demonstrate knowledge and understanding in the main field of study, including knowledge of the disciplinary foundation of the field, knowledge of applicable methodologies in the field, specialised study in some aspect of the field as well as awareness of current research issues.

#### *Competence and skills*

For a Bachelor's degree, students shall:

- demonstrate the ability to search for, gather, evaluate and critically interpret the relevant information for a formulated problem and also discuss phenomena, issues and situations critically,
- demonstrate the ability to identify, formulate and solve problems independently and to complete tasks within predetermined time frames,
- demonstrate the ability to present and discuss information, problems and solutions in speech and writing and in dialogue with different audiences, and
- demonstrate the skills required to work independently in the main field of study.

#### *Judgement and approach*

For a Bachelor's degree, students shall:

- demonstrate the ability to make assessments in the main field of study informed by relevant disciplinary, social and ethical issues,
- demonstrate insight into the role of knowledge in society and the responsibility of the individual for how it is used, and
- demonstrate the ability to identify the need for further knowledge and ongoing development.

### Local outcomes

Upon completion of the Political Science programme at Karlstad University, students should be able to demonstrate the necessary knowledge and skills to work independently with a high level of critical awareness in administrative, political, economic and legal roles and functions in the private and the public sectors.

Upon completion of the programme, students should also be able to demonstrate:

- knowledge and understanding of basic economic, political, legal and organisational contexts and situations, the role of public administration in society and current research in the chosen main field of study,
- the ability to identify, structure, evaluate, analyse and interpret various economic, political, legal and organisational problems with respect to relevant scientific, societal and ethical aspects,
- the ability to apply various perspectives in assessing and solving economic, political, legal and organisational problems,
- the ability to present and discuss relevant information both orally and in written form with experts as well as with non-specialists,
- the ability to work independently and in collaboration with other students in the relevant field of study.

To earn a Bachelor's degree, students must also undertake and present a 15-ECTS credit degree project in the chosen main field of study.

### **Programme Structure**

The programme comprises three required subjects: Political Science (30 ECTS cr.), Economics (30 ECTS cr.) and Law (15 ECTS cr.). Students select either Political Science or Economics as main field of study for their degrees. A main field of study has to comprise three semesters' worth of courses (90 ECTS cr.).

The semester of optional courses may be used for further specialisation based on students' own interests and goals. Optional courses may be selected from the courses offered by the university or by other universities or higher education institutions in Sweden or abroad. This semester may also be used to do an internship in Sweden or abroad that may yield either 15 or 30 ECTS credits, depending on its duration.

Optional courses must not overlap to any significant extent with other courses on the Political Science programme.

### **Programme Curriculum**

The programme comprises a number of courses at different levels:

- Basic courses, 1–30 ECTS cr.
- Intermediate courses, 31–60 ECTS cr.
- Advanced courses, 61–90 ECTS cr.

Courses are taken in the following order (please note that course titles are subject to change):

- Semester 1 Political Science A (30 ECTS cr.)
- Semester 2 Economics for the Political Science programme (30 ECTS cr.)
- Semester 3 Law I and II (30 ECTS cr.)  
or  
Law I (15 ECTS cr.) and Statistics (15 ECTS cr.)\*
- Semester 4 Political Science specialisation: Political Science II (30 ECTS cr.)  
Economics specialisation: Intermediate course in Economics (30 ECTS cr.)
- Semester 5 Optional courses (30 ECTS cr.)
- Semester 6 Political Science specialisation: Political Science III (30 ECTS cr.)  
Economics specialisation: Economics, 30 ECTS credits that include the courses Economic Growth/Macroeconomics (7.5 ECTS cr.) and Bachelor's essay (15 ECTS cr.), as well as one of the courses Valuation of Portfolio Selection (7.5 ECTS cr.), Labour Economics (7.5 ECTS cr.), Public Economics and Politics (7.5 ECTS cr.), or Industrial Organisation and Business Strategies (7.5 ECTS cr.)

\* Statistics (15 ECTS cr.) is a required course for the Economics specialisation
